The following awards will be given:

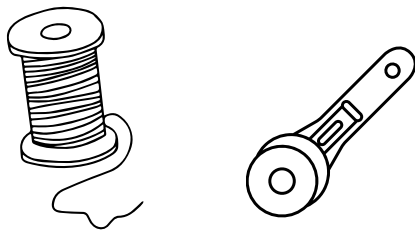
- \$300 Grand Prize

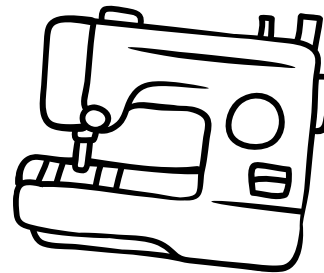

GET INVOLVED

School Block Challenge is an annual, nationwide competition and exhibit sponsored by Moda Fabrics and coordinated by The National Quilt Museum. Students in grades K-12 are invited to learn about quilting by creating their own quilt block to enter in the exhibit contest. All blocks entered will be exhibited at the museum during the 1st quarter of the year. All blocks will be returned after the close of the exhibit. Winning blocks will also be shared on the museum's website.

CONTEST RULES

- Blocks are to be constructed by students in grades K-12. They can work individually, in pairs, or in groups. A student may only submit and be represented on one (1) entry block.
- Students may make a block on their own at home, or as part of a school classroom, club, homeschool, 4-H group, Scout troop, etc.
- Blocks can be based on existing quilt patterns or be an original design.
- Blocks must measure 16" x 16" square. Blocks varying more than 1" larger or smaller will be disqualified from judging. Please note block orientation on the back.
- A recognizable piece of all 3 challenge fabrics must be included in the block. Additional fabrics may be added as desired. No loose glitter. Blocks not using all 3 challenge fabrics will be disqualified from judging.
- Blocks must include some machine or hand stitching, but should not be fully quilted.
- Please do not frame or mount the block to anything other than fabric.
- Work is to be completed by the students, though adult assistance is welcome when working with irons, sewing machines, rotary cutters, or needles.
- Entry forms are to be completed neatly and attached with pin or paperclip to the block. Do not staple entry materials to the block.
- To be eligible for judging, all entries must be postmarked by or hand-delivered on the deadline to NQM.
- Blocks will be judged and winners chosen based on craftsmanship, creative use of the challenge fabrics, overall composition, and submission of entry materials.
- Award winners will be notified via email or phone. Prize money checks will be sent via mail or given in person.
