



Victoria Findlay Wolfe's *Option Expedition* at The National Quilt Museum January 24 – September 9, 2025

Paducah, KY., January 23, 2025 – The National Quilt Museum opens its 2025 exhibition schedule with award-winning quilter, artist, and teacher Victoria Findlay Wolfe's exhibition *Option Expedition* sponsored by Baptist Health Paducah.

Findlay Wolfe takes basic patchwork shapes—square, circle, triangle, parallelogram—and breaks down design principles of space, balance, scale, line, shape, color, emphasis, contrast, value, repetition, movement, texture, and unity to examine the bold, beautiful choices available in *Option Expedition*.

An installation in The National Quilt Museum's lobby pays homage to Findlay Wolfe's passions: quilting and riding her Harley. *Harley Storm*, a visually stunning quilt made from her massive collection of Harley-Davidson t-shirts, is parked next to a brand new Harley, courtesy of Four Rivers Harley-Davidson.

Visitors can meet Findlay Wolfe at an artist talk at The National Quilt Museum during AQS QuiltWeek on Saturday, April 26, at 11:00 a.m. Bonnie Schrock, executive director of The National Quilt Museum, said, "We are excited to host Victoria. Her bold quilts and bold approach to life are an excellent example of what the museum is all about honoring Today's Quilters." *Option Expedition* runs from January 24 through September 9, 2025.

The National Quilt Museum is located at 215 Jefferson Street in Paducah, Kentucky, and is open daily from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Saturday and 1 p.m. through 5 p.m. on Sunday. Tickets may be purchased online or upon arrival. Complimentary parking is available onsite. Admission is \$15 for adults, \$13 for seniors (62 and older) and military, \$5 for students, and complimentary for children under 12 with a paying adult and members.
